Sharpe Ratio: Average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of volatility or total risk. Subtracting the risk-free rate from the mean return, the performance associated with risk-taking activities can be isolated.

Sortino Ratio: Measures the risk-adjusted return of an investment asset, portfolio, or strategy. It is a modification of the Sharpe ratio but penalizes only those returns falling below a user-specified target or required rate of return, while the Sharpe ratio penalizes both upside and downside volatility equally.

Standard Deviation: Known as historical volatility and is used by investors as a gauge for the amount of expected volatility.

Upside Capture Ratio: Statistical measure of an investment manager's overall performance in up-markets. The up-market capture ratio is used to evaluate how well an investment manager performed relative to an index during periods when that index has risen.

Downside Capture Ratio: Statistical measure of an investment manager's overall performance in down-markets. It is used to evaluate how well an investment manager performed relative to an index during periods when that index has dropped.

An upside capture ratio over 100 indicates a fund has generally outperformed the benchmark during periods of positive returns for the benchmark. Meanwhile, a downside capture ratio of less than 100 indicates that a fund has lost less than its benchmark in periods when the benchmark has been in the red. A negative downside capture indicates the fund has gained when its benchmark has been in the red. All bond funds' ratios are calculated relative to the Barclays Capital U.S. Aggregate Bond Index.

Launched in 2010, Leader Total Return Fund has focused on maximizing total return potential through the ups and downs of bond market cycles. The Fund is a diversified portfolio of bonds across various fixed income sectors that is actively managed to maximize return and generate a high level of income.

Market & Fund Commentary

July was a great month for equity markets; there seemed to be a calm post after all the trade war headlines. As we mentioned last month, the major indices held some very key levels to close the second quarter. July saw less headlines, less volatility, and risk assets move higher across the board.

High Yield Credit spreads tightened with the equity rally (-33bps) over July from June. Investment Grade spreads also rallied and tightened (-8bps). There was some volatility in treasuries as yields gave up much of their June tightening. We remain cautious on longer duration bonds as well as the front end of the curve. In the front end, we still favor floating rate bonds.

We made some larger portfolio changes this month after leaving the previous couple months largely unchanged. We pared down a sizeable allocation to CLO Equity tranches after we collected the July quarterly payments. That allocation now rests at around 10% of the portfolios. We pared exposure there as we saw the rally in risk assets and credit spreads as an opportunity to reduce exposure to something that could move with velocity to the downside in the event of a larger market pullback. We continue to take advantage of yields within Agency Mortgage bonds and mitigating volatility with our convertible bonds. We also began adding some bonds in the fix to float (hybrid) space mainly in the large domestic banks. These bonds offer us above average yields, short durations (to call date), and a floating rate mechanism that kicks in when the bond is callable. We view the risk rewards in these bonds as attractive, have short durations, attractive floating rate yields if not called, and above average yields than investment grade corporates.

We continue to look for opportunities across asset classes. High yield corporates continue to trade at yields not worth the risk. We are monitoring Emerging markets, but need to see more stability. Adding duration could be on table as well. We continue to monitor inflation expectations and key technical levels on the 10-Year US Treasury yield for entry points.

Definitions:

S&P 500: Standard and Poor's 500 Index is a capitalization-weighted index of 500 stocks. The index is designed to measure performance of the broad domestic economy through changes in the aggregate market value of 500 stocks representing all major industries.

CLOs: Collateralized loan obligations (CLOs) are a form of securitization where payments from multiple middle sized and large business loans are pooled together and passed on to different classes of owners in various tranches. A CLO is a type of collateralized debt obligation.

Basis Point ("bps"): one hundredth of one percent, used chiefly in expressing differences of interest rates
